The finance council echoes the remarks of our pastor for the fiscal year, as we have progressed from pandemic to recovery to a framework of renewal and steady growth.

The finance council remained engaged, vigilant, and supportive of the pastor and our entire parish community during this time. We met 9 times during the year, primarily inperson, with additional work by our budget and capital projects/operations committees, culminating in reviews and approvals of FY 2024 budgets for the parish, school, and preschool. We also launched a communication and giving task force to support the pastor's outreach efforts this spring and summer.

Our parish, school, and preschool finances are on sound financial footing, thanks to the continued generosity of St. Michael's parishioners and the ongoing diligence of our clergy leadership, parish and diocesan professional staff, and ministry volunteers.



2024 BUDGET PROJECTIONS

St. Michael consists of three distinct and interrelated entities: the Parish, the Preschool, and the School. The Parish Finance Council reviews monthly, quarterly, and annual financial reports from all three entities.


FY 2024 Parish budget projects \$3,583,900 in revenues and an equal amount of expenses. The largest component of projected revenue is Offertory collections, making up **79%** of revenue, and the current budgets collections are assumed to be **5%** over prior year collections. The largest expenses for the Parish are religious and lay salaries which make up **48%** of projected expenses.

The FY 2024 Parish School budget projects \$4,388,300 in revenues and an equal amount of expenses. As expected, the majority of the revenue comes from tuition, which makes up 94% of total Revenue. The tuition receipts for school are determined mainly by the projected numbers of students enrolled in the school and the tuition rate. The 2024 budget assumes a 6% tuition increase over previous years and 507 enrolled students which is slightly less than enrollment for the current year. Again, the largest expense line item for the school is salaries which make up 58% of the projected expenses.

The FY 2024 Parish Preschool budget projects \$562,800 in revenues and an equal amount of expenses. Similarly to the school, the majority of preschool revenues comes from tuition, 83% of total revenue, and the largest expense is salaries at 64% of projected expenses.

Worship



Through your generosity, our parish of **4,975 families** have worshipped together this year, both in-person and virtually. Our Worship ministry volunteer groups include several Mass Choirs, Mass Technology volunteers, Altar Cleaning and Linens ministries, Altar Robe Ministry, Adoration Ministry, Funeral Ministry, Wedding Ministry, Prayer Groups, Weekday Mass Volunteers, Ministers of Hospitality, Mass Coordinators, Lector Ministry, and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. This past year, our community celebrated **178** Baptisms, **172** individuals received First Holy Communion, **189** Confirmations, **42** Marriages, **260** hours of Reconciliation, **380** Anointings of the Sick, **260** Funerals, and many hours of Adoration.





Facilities

Thanks to your generosity, the Operations team continues to be able to make improvements on our campus. This past year, we completed the final upgrades and repairs to the restrooms on campus, as well as refreshed the **Parish Conference**Center. Not only did this include important maintenance items like new windows and doors, as well as the installation of safety and security film on the windows, it included cosmetic enhancements which allowed us to serve on average 25 different ministries and groups on campus for meeting space.

We also continued to **invest in the safety and security** of our school with a new shingle roof, replacing the roof which was at the end of its life cycle, add safety and security film to all the windows and doors, as well as upgrading the fire alarm systems in both the school building and the Archangel Hall Gym. With the increased activity on campus, we completed a minor renovation of the ground floor of the **Trinity Center** – adding additional classroom style meeting spaces for groups such as RCIA. Additionally, we replaced the entry door with a glass door, which more clearly identifies the main parish offices, but also is more welcoming to our parishioners and visitors on campus.

Your generosity also supported the addition of **audio-visual technology** to many of the meeting rooms for use by ministries with digital materials. In addition, we updated our network, began work on updating our phone system to replace the aging analog system, and invested in new software applications such as **Mass Intentions Online** to make requesting Mass Intentions an easier and more transparent process.

We continued to work on **maintenance of the Columbarium and parish landscape**, as well as made important updates to the home that our Religious Sisters will now occupy as the **new Convent**. We are truly excited for the year ahead, as we welcome additional ministries to campus and look to continue to provide them with space to carry our parish mission or Worship, Education, and Service, none of which would be possible without your continuing financial support, generosity, and prayer.

Service



Our Pastoral Care Office served many families and individuals this past year, including various forms of support in counseling, direct service, walk-in service for financial assistance, bereavement groups, Catholic Parish Outreach, senior socials, and other ministries. This year, the office served over 600 Prayers of the Faithful, 380 Priest Requests, 500 Seniors attending 5 Senior Socials (a ministry that began following COVID-19 re-entry), 40 families with Grief Support, and 15 families with Dementia Caregiver Support. The Thanksgiving Basket Ministry served 150 families distributed through Doorway to Hope, Pardoned by Christ, and Dorcas, and 350 families received Christmas gifts through the Jesse Tree Ministry. 1,000 children and 125 families received Migrant Meals this year. This year, the Habitat for Humanity Ministry built a home in partnership with Cary Coalition. Our Honduras Sister Parish received assistance for spiritual education, supplies, and assistance for medical clinics, for supplies of over 800 school students, and for agricultural education and tools. Assistance was also provided for families in the form of water filtration, latrine projects, basic hygiene supplies and projects. Our SHARES Ministry served 65 families with emergency support in partnership with Catholic Charities. Approximately 50 Columbarium sales took place this past year.

Education

Our Adult & Youth Faith Formation programs, including 99 Catechists and facilitators, served 646 children and adults through a variety of programs this year. Programs included preparation for receiving sacraments, adult studies, men's groups, women's groups, youth programs, Parish Missions, and St. Mike's Tikes.

St. Michael School had a very successful year. Total enrollment: **505** students; **59** students graduated from the 8th grade.

St. Michael Preschool also had a very successful year with in-person education the entire year. Enrollment for the past year was **151** students in **11** classes.







FINANCIAL COUNCIL OVERVIEW

The St. Michael the Archangel parish finance council has 9 members, including the chair, divided into two committees: budget and capital/operations.

THE FINANCE COUNCIL HAS THREE PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Advise the Pastor concerning the administration of parish funds and other assets
- **Contribute** expertise, regarding reports, budgets, strategic planning, forecasts, best practices, etc.
- Endorse acts of extraordinary administration such as significant capital expenditures

THE ROLE OF A FINANCE COUNCIL MEMBER

The most important role of a finance council member is to ensure St. Michael will continue to serve as a strong provider of religious, educational, and related services. Additionally, the Finance Council ensures that financial budgets and actual spending are balanced and conservative. In this role, members review and approve proposed budgets and contracts with suppliers of goods and services, as well as review financial statements for the parish, school, and preschool on a monthly basis. We work collaboratively to identity that supplier contracts are necessary and in the best interest of St. Michael and that financial reports are accurate and transparent. The Finance Council strives to ensure that all projects and services of St. Michael is paid with existing savings and reasonably expected revenue, and without threatening the future viability of the parish, school, and preschool.
