Thanks to all of you for recycling items curbside through the Town of Cary! It shows your "adoption of a sustainable lifestyle," which is one of the goals of Pope Francis' Laudato Si' encyclical.

Here's some interesting tidbits regarding curbside recycling:

- Shredded paper is no longer accepted.
- · Cardboard that gets wet is no longer a viable product for recycling so be sure you close the lid on your recycling bin.
- Be sure NOT to include any plastic bags in your recycling cart.

The type of items that can be placed in the Town of Cary recyclable carts is limited. Thankfully, there are local stores and organizations that offer additional recycling or reuse opportunities. Another way to reduce waste is to repair items that are broken. The **Repair** Café NC offers free workshops to people throughout NC, including in Cary.
